# How to get started as a health care sustainability physician champion





As trusted leaders, physicians can be champions of environmentally responsible health care – but how do you get started? Here are some tips and resources to help you begin your journey as a health care sustainability champion.

### Get educated, then educate others

### **GET EDUCATED**

- Visit the <u>Health Care Without Harm</u> and <u>Practice Greenhealth</u> websites to learn about health care's environmental impact and opportunities to move toward <u>climate-smart</u>, environmentally responsible health care.
- · Visit the Physician Network resource site.
- Plan to attend the many physician-led, CME-eligible sessions at <u>CleanMed</u>, the premier conference for health care sustainability leaders.
- Learn about the <u>business case</u> for health sector sustainability, including the potential costs savings highlighted in this report.
- Learn about the <u>public health impacts</u> of climate change and <u>environmental health</u>, as well as the health benefits of practicing <u>sustainability in your home</u>, medical practice, and community.
- Read policy statements from the <u>American College of Physicians</u>, <u>American Academy of Pediatrics</u>, and <u>American College of Emergency Physicians</u> calling on physicians to reduce the environmental impact of health care facilities
- Check out the American College of Physicians' <u>climate change toolkit</u> and the American Society of Anesthesiologists' <u>environmental sustainability</u> resources, and see what's available in your own medical society.

### **EDUCATE OTHERS**

- Educate your colleagues about how to reduce environmental impact, with a focus on specific opportunities in your hospital.
- Present at grand rounds or a department meeting.
- Invite an expert speaker from Health Care Without Harm, Practice Greenhealth, or the Physician Network Speakers Bureau.
- Write a blog or article for your hospital newsletter.
- · Share your knowledge on social media.
- Talk to your patients about how <u>climate impacts their health</u> and how they can <u>reduce environmental exposures</u>.

### Conduct an internal sustainability assessment

- Find out if your hospital or health system is part of the Practice Greenhealth network.
  - If your hospital or health system is a Practice Greenhealth partner, <u>request access</u> to exclusive resources and get connected to your member engagement manager.
  - If your hospital isn't a Practice Greenhealth partner, learn more about the <u>benefits of becoming a part of the</u>

- Conduct an <u>assessment of current sustainability practices</u> in your hospital.
  - Find out what programs are already in place and where new opportunities exist.
  - Does your hospital or health system have a green team or sustainability manager?
- Get key stakeholders involved, including environmental services, food services, pharmacy, purchasing, facilities, nursing, and operating room staff.
- What does your leadership care about?
  - Are your hospital's operations aligned with its mission statement?
  - What are your hospital's current priorities?
- You likely aren't alone in your interest, so ask around and find your allies.

# Conduct an external sustainability assessment

- Are other hospitals in your community and state Practice Greenhealth members? Have they made a commitment to sustainability?
- Has your community made a commitment to renewable energy, reducing waste, or greenhouse gas emission reduction?
- What are the health and environmental issues in your community? Read your hospital's <u>community benefit report</u> to see if the top health needs are related to environmental determinants of health.
- What are the climate risks in your community? Is your hospital prepared for severe weather events? <u>Learn how</u> extreme weather can impact health care delivery.

# Start a sustainability program at your hospital or health system

- Use Practice Greenhealth's <u>engaged leadership toolkit</u> to develop a strategy for talking to your hospital's leaders about sustainability.
- Be very clear about what you're asking for, such as joining Practice Greenhealth, starting or leading a green team, creating a recycling program, making a public commitment to climate action, starting a greening the OR program, etc.
- Who are you going to ask and how? This might include a letter, email, or in-person meeting with administrators or the board of directors.
- Know your audience and what is important to them, and customize your presentation accordingly. Highlight relevant facts, data, and information.
- Focus on solutions and the benefits of sustainability to your hospital, health system, patients, and community.
- Identify clear next steps and have a follow-up plan.
